TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of El Monte (the "City") is reopening the application process for the **2021-2022 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) on Monday August 9, 2021**. The City is an entitlement community and has received CDBG funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for Fiscal Year 2021-2022. The Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) covers a one-year period for CDBG activities that will begin July 1, 2021, and end June 30, 2022. Funding will be contingent on availability from HUD and will be administered by the City through its Housing Division. Activities that benefit low and moderate-income El Monte residents, meet HUD program objectives and align with the City's priorities are encouraged to apply.

All applications must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, August 30, 2021. Applications not submitted in the ZoomGrants system prior to the deadline will not be eligible.

No hand-delivered, mailed, faxed or e-mailed applications will be accepted. Applications **MUST** be submitted through the ZoomGrants system. Attach only the required documentation. Any additional information not requested will be disposed of and not considered as part of the application.

Applications that are incomplete, have an inadequate number of copies, exceed the prescribed response limits, have content errors or deficiencies, or submitted after the deadline, will be rejected. Once submitted, proposals may not be amended, unless the amendment has been requested by the City.

The City, at its sole discretion, with or without cause, and without liability to any applicant, reserves the right to accept or reject and/or all proposals, cancel this NOFA at any time, and/or take any action in the best interest of the City. The City will evaluate proposals for CDBG eligibility. After the proposals are evaluated, City staff will make recommendations for the total amount of CDBG funds for consideration in the City's Action Plan, Substantial Amendment #1. The City Council will hold public hearings to consider funding allocation recommendations in the Action Plan, Substantial Amendment #1. The El Monte City Council approves final CDBG allocations.
