**Bid Security:** Each proposal must be accompanied by a Bid Security in the form of a cashier's check, certified check, or bid bond executed on the prescribed form, in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the total bid price payable to the City of El Monte. Bidders are hereby notified that in accordance with the provisions of Public Contract Code section 22300, securities may be substituted for any monies which the City may withhold pursuant to the terms of this Contract to ensure performance.

**Prior to the bid due date and time,** all Bidders shall submit the original Bid Security to the City Clerk. Proof of delivery that is date/time stamped and signed for by the City Clerk from other couriers other than Certified mail will be accepted. A copy of the proof of delivery shall be submitted with the bid package by the bid due date.

**Contractor's License:** Bidder must possess a current **Class "A" General Engineering Contractor license; Class "B" General Building Contractor license combined with "C-33" License; Class "B" General Building Contractor license combined with "C-61" License plus "D-42" License; Class "C-33" license; or Class "C-61" plus "D-42" License** issued by the State of California, at the time the bid is submitted. Bidder must possess lead certification issued by the California Environmental Protection Agency. All required licenses shall be issued by the State of California, lead certification must be obtained prior to the start of work.

**Contractor Registration:** All Bidders and listed subcontractors must have registered with the California State Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 prior to submitting a Bid. Furthermore, a Contractor and all subcontractors must be registered pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 before entering into a contract to work on a public project.

**City's Right to Postpone Opening of Bids.** The City reserves the right to postpone the date and time for the opening of Bids at any time prior to the date and time initially announced in this Invitation to Bid in accordance with applicable law.

**Opening of Bids.** Bids will be received by the City via the electronic submission up to the date and time shown in the Notice of Inviting Bids. The City will be responsible for bid tabulations. Bids will be opened and read out loud by the City Clerk's Office in Council Chambers at the date and time stated in the Notice of Inviting Bids. Bid results will be made available to the public on the City's website in the electronic bid management system once the bid tabulation has been completed.

**Award:** The award shall be made to the lowest responsible Bidder whose proposal complies with the specified requirements. The foregoing notwithstanding, the award of any contract shall be subject to approval by the City Council at a duly noticed City Council meeting. Contractor shall execute the Contract within ten (10) days after it has received the Contract from the City. The City reserves the right to waive any irregularity in the proposals. No bid may be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days after the opening of bids.

**Rejection of Bids:** The City reserves the right to reject any and all Bids. The City

and equipment necessary to complete the work as shown on the construction drawings and within these specifications and no additional compensation shall be allowed. This includes the cost of work not specifically listed in the Bid Schedule or Schedule of Values but is necessary to complete the project as described and shown in the Contract Documents. Work for which no separate payment has been provided will be considered a subsidiary obligation of the CONTRACTOR, and the cost therefore shall be included in the applicable contract price for the item to which the work applies. All measurements of work done will be made by the AGENCY or its representative.

**BID ITEM NO. 1 – MOBILIZATION, BONDS, PERMITS, CLEANUP AND DEMOBILIZATION SHALL NOT EXCEED 5% OF CONTRACTORS BID TOTAL**

Payment for mobilization, bonds, permits, cleanup, and demobilization for curb address painting shall be made at the contract lump sum price, limited to 5% of the total contract amount, complete and in accordance with the Contract Documents, and as directed by the AGENCY. The Contract Price shall include, but is not limited to, the following principal items: obtaining all necessary permits, insurance, and bonds; covering premiums and incidentals; preparing the project schedule and schedule of values; mobilizing labor, equipment, and materials onto the site; securing water supply for cleaning; providing power necessary for operations; supplying all temporary construction; installing and removing any necessary equipment; providing traffic control as required; providing on-site sanitary facilities; posting OSHA requirements; establishing safety programs; and performing all work and documentation necessary for mobilization, bonding, and permitting for the curb address painting project as described within the Contract Documents. This work also includes the cost for development and maintenance of the maintaining project schedule, photos of individual complete curb address paint and submitting them to the AGENCY at the project's conclusion. These record documents must be reviewed monthly with the AGENCY to receive payment for any work.

Work to be paid for under this item shall also include compliance with the **Agency Construction & Demolition Waste Management Plan**, as well as using the **City's C&D Waste Hauler, Valley Vista Services, at (626) 736-7782, attention Joel Somalian**.

The lump sum payment for this item shall be made to the Contractor based on the percentage of completion of the specific work components, as detailed in the Contractor's submitted schedule of values and upon receipt of all required insurance documents. Upon completion of mobilization and approval of the baseline schedule, 30% of the amount bid for this item will be paid to the Contractor

**BID ITEM NO. 2 – CURB ADDRESS PAINTING SERVICES INCLUDING NOTIFICATION TO THE PUBLIC**

Payment for curb address painting services including notification to the public shall be made at the contract unit price, complete and in accordance with the Contract Documents, and as directed by the AGENCY. The Contract Price for work under this item shall include, but is not limited to, furnishing all labor, material, tools, and equipment necessary for the proper execution of curb address painting. This includes, but is not necessarily limited to, surface preparation, accurate measuring and marking for placement, and the application of paint to ensure visibility and longevity. The contractor shall be responsible for notifying residents at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance prior to commencing any work. The contractor is required to submit a notification flyer to the ENGINEER for approval. A sample notification flyer is provided in Part 5 "Standard and Technical Provisions." The contractor shall also be responsible for conducting inspections to verify that the painted addresses comply with project specifications for size, color, and positioning. Additionally, all activities must adhere to applicable safety regulations and local guidelines to ensure a professional appearance and lasting results on the curb face.

### BID ITEM NO. 3 – CURB ADDRESS PAINTING SERVICES IN EXCESS OF THE QUANTITY SPECIFIED IN BID ITEM NO. 2

Payment for curb address painting services in excess of the quantity specified in Bid Item No. 2 shall be made at the contract unit price, complete and in accordance with the Contract Documents, and as directed by the AGENCY. The Contract Price for work under this item shall include, but is not limited to, furnishing all labor, material, tools, and equipment necessary for the additional execution of curb address painting. This includes, but is not necessarily limited to, surface preparation, precise measuring and marking for placement, and the application of paint to ensure visibility and durability. The contractor shall also be responsible for conducting inspections to verify that the additional painted addresses conform to project specifications for size, color, and positioning. Furthermore, all activities must comply with applicable safety regulations and local guidelines to ensure a professional appearance and lasting results on the curb face.

### BID ITEM NO. 4 – LEAD ENCAPSULATION AND TRAFFIC CONTROL FOR ANY WORK INCLUDING ADDITIONAL WORK AS PART OF BID ITEM NO. 3

Payment for lead encapsulation and traffic control for any work including additional work as part of Bid Item No. 3 shall be made at the contract lump sum price, complete and in accordance with the Contract Documents, and as directed by the AGENCY. The Contract Price for work under this item shall include, but is not limited to, furnishing all labor, material, tools, and equipment necessary for the effective encapsulation of lead-containing materials. This includes, but is not necessarily limited to, surface preparation, the application of encapsulant, and ensuring that all surfaces are adequately covered to prevent lead exposure. The contractor shall furnish proof of completing all training or certification requirements for lead abatement. The contractor shall also be responsible for conducting inspections to verify that the encapsulated areas meet project specifications for safety and compliance. Additionally, all activities must adhere to applicable safety regulations, environmental guidelines, and local health codes to ensure a safe and compliant work environment throughout the project. The contractor shall also be responsible for setting up traffic control devices, including barriers, signage, and personnel, to manage traffic flow safely around the work zones. Additionally, this work includes monitoring and documenting compliance with safety regulations, as well as preparing all necessary reports for regulatory agencies. All necessary reporting and documentation must be provided to demonstrate compliance with regulatory requirements.

#### **1.04 ORDER OF PRECEDENCE**

If there is a conflict between any of the Contract Documents, the document highest in the order of precedence shall control. The order of precedence, from highest to lowest, shall be as follows:

- a) Permits issued by jurisdictional regulatory agencies.
- b) Change Orders and Supplemental Agreements; whichever occurs last.
- c) Contract/ Agreement.
- d) Addenda.
- e) Bid/Proposal.
- f) Special Provisions.
- g) General Provisions
- h) Plans.
- i) Standard Plans.
- j) Standard Specifications.
- k) Reference Specifications.

# **PART 5: STANDARD AND TECHNICAL PROVISIONS**

## **CITYWIDE CURB ADDRESS PAINTING**

The standard provisions for this contract shall be made to clarify the scope of work for the project. The contractor is hereby required, but not limited to: Notifying residents forty-eight (48) hours in advance prior to commencing any work, providing traffic control as required, protecting existing flags/logos in place, encapsulation of existing lead-based paint as necessary, scraping off existing numerals to bare concrete surface, painting new reflective white background and black numerals, and furnishing all labor, material, and tools necessary for clean-up of each work site.

The technical provisions for this contract shall be in conformance with Section 214, “Traffic Striping, Curb and Pavement Markings, and Pavement Markers” of Part 2, “Construction Materials” and Section 314, “Traffic Striping, Curb and Pavement Markings, and Pavement Markers” of Part 3, “Construction Methods,” of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, 2024 Edition, (SPPWC or Greenbook 2024).

The City of El Monte has hired a contractor to scrape off the existing curb address paint and paint new, reflective white backgrounds and reflective black numerals. This service is being provided at no cost to residents or property owners. Please do not pay the painters. The contractor will paint your address within forty-eight (48) hours of the receipt of this notice. Please be sure to park your vehicles away from the existing painted curb addresses.

**Existing Painted Flags or Murals** – The contractor will avoid painting over flags and logos, and only remove and paint the number part of the curb address.
